

MESSAGES	Messages for delegates may be left at the ESCP registration desk during opening hours. Messages will be displayed on the message board located in the registration area.
POSTERS	Posters are grouped into 5 topics, Neoplasia (located on the ground floor level, in RO accessed through the exhibition hall), Functional, IBD, Proctology and Miscellaneous, all located on the lower mezzanine level, (Grande Gallerie) accessed by taking the stairs/ escalator down from registration towards the main auditorium.
PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN NANTES	Local: travel within the city is available by tram or bus and a map of the city which includes information about trams, is provided in each delegate bag; further supplies are available at registration.
	Nantes Atlantique International Airport is located 8km from the city centre and can be reached by taxi (approximately €25) or by tram. A taxi ride will generally take 15-25 minutes depending on the volume of traffic. Tram line 3 operates from the city centre to La Neustrie terminus, where a shuttle bus (number 37) links to the airport terminal. Allow approximately 50 minutes from the centre of town to reach the airport using this route. Trams operate every 10 minutes between Monday and Saturday. Check timetables for information regarding Sunday which is less frequent.
	Additionally, the TAN (Nantes Area Transport Company) bus service links the centre of Nantes to the airport from the southern SNCF railway station which takes 20 minutes. TAN tickets may also be used on the 37 service.
	Travel within France: Nantes railway station lies on a number of rail lines. Nantes is connected by TGV (high speed train) to Paris, Lyon, Marseille, Lille, and Strasbourg, with trains to Paris via the LGV Atlantique taking just over 2 hours into Montparnasse station. By Corail, Nantes is connected to Quimper, La Rochelle, Bordeaux, Lyon, and Toulouse. The regional trains and buses of the TER Pays de la Loire provide links to Saint-Nazaire, Angers, Le Mans, La Roche sur Yon, and many other regional cities.

Accompanying Persons' Walking Tour Thursday 25 September 10:00-15:00

A wonderful introduction to Nantes, walking through the medieval city's narrow streets, a visit to the Cathedral, the Castle and the Passage Pommeraye, an elegant 19th century shopping gallery on three levels. Includes lunch at le Bistro de l'écrivain restaurant. Comfortable walking shoes are advisable and an umbrella just in case of showers. Included in Accompanying Persons' registration fee.

Muscadet Country

Friday 26 September 10:00-17:00

Transfer by coach to Le Château de Goulaine, home of the Goulaine family for over 1000 years. Visit its unique rooms, before moving on to large greenhouses that are home to hundreds of tropical butterflies. Visit also the "LU collection" which tells about the world famous biscuit trade. Lunch at a traditional French brasserie, followed by a short visit to Clisson, a delighteful Italian style town, with its impressive medieval castle on the banks of the Sèvre and the Moine. A short stroll in the old streets, the covered market "les Halles", the castle and the two bridges. Return to Nantes by 17:00.

Saint Nazaire & the Coast of Amour Saturday 27 September 14:00 onwards

Coaches will depart when meeting sessions end, enabling all delegates to enjoy this relaxed afternoon and evening. A packed lunch will be provided as we depart Nantes, stopping at "Escal'Atlantic", St. Nazaire's submarine base, an exhibition dedicated to the area's renowned ship-building industry over centuries. Followed by a walk in "Marais Salants", the last place in France producing craft salt, then onwards to the beaches of La Baule and Pouliguen for dinner at a restaurant overlooking the beach. Return to the Convention Centre at 23:00.

With Celtic, Roman and Briton and Normal influences, Nantes is architecturally impressive, and its buildings and culture will astonish the visitor. Nantes provides an exceptionally convivial atmosphere in which a first class convention centre, excellent hotels and restaurants are all found within walking distance of each other. Around every corner you can find churches, beautiful frescoes, mills and shopping galleries, yet within minutes there is wonderful countryside and vineyards.

Boat excursions are close at hand in Nantes, from which wonderful countryside can be seen, in contrast to the city's narrow streets which you can explore on foot. Nantes is the 6th largest city in France, but has retained its friendly, vibrant, cosmopolitan and characteristic French atmosphere with lots of different cafés and restaurants where one can explore typical food and beverage and enjoy French hospitality.

Nantes is renowned for its fresh fish and seafood which comes from the lakes and marshes nearby. Traditional recipes boast simple yet delicious flavours, with exquisite and magnificent wines from local Muscadet wines.

ESCP MEMBERSHIP	 Membership Structure: "Regular membership" is available either to Full Members resident in Europe, or to Voting Members from outside Europe, in each case, being registered physicians who have a demonstrable interest in coloproctology. Regular members need the support of two other regular members. Full (regular) members are European residents with full voting rights and may be elected for office. (Regular) Voting members are from outside Europe with full voting rights but may not be elected for office. "Extraordinary membership" is available to Trainee Members (those in training appointments), to Affiliate Members who are not medically qualified (technicians, nurse or scientist) working in the field of coloproctology. Extraordinary members in these three categories do not have the right to vote or to be elected.
ON-LINE MEMBERSHIP	In 2007, ESCP began to handle membership payments online in order to make the process of membership payments much more straightforward. If you have completed membership this year and paid by credit card, membership for 2009 will automatically be processed in December, and we will notify you by e-mail at that time. If you have not yet joined ESCP, we invite you to consider doing so! The Society needs the support of its members in order to cover administrative costs, and to guarantee a stable base from which to organise stimulating and advancing congresses into the future.
